

Artist Statement

"My subject matter captures the world I live in, the people in my environment, thus my artworks are a form of social commentary. In my earlier work I responded to the poverty and suffering that I saw around me. However, in my more recent works I have chosen to focus on happier everyday occurrences in the inner city, and my works began to describe a greater array of emotions that express the human condition despite circumstances.

My works consist of human figures placed against a collaged background reflecting global issues that have affected South Africa and the broader African continent. Although the collaged background tends to flatten the illusion of space, I wish to depict real people with dreams and aspirations, people who occupy space. The style of my work is therefore a form of realism, and the people are painted in a naturalistic way. I am inflenced by impressionism and realism, as the subject matter for both of these styles focuses on 'the ordinary person' and their daily lives.

I use photographs that I have taken as source material and see my works as series. I tend to group these together, that way I keep track of my progress or growth with every series. My work is undergoing a gradual change as I am beginning to work in layers now. It is still in its early stages of development but I am interested in the relationship between the figures and the collaged elements. I have always been intensely fascinated with colour and since the backgrounds are mostly monochrome I make sure the colour of the figures stand out. I wish to use my art to motivate and inspire people. I hope that my pieces get people thinking because I feel that I am documenting history past and present. I am proud of my journey thus far and am motivated by the fact that I love what I do for a living."

Biography

Andrew Ntshabele was born in the small rural town of Moruleng in the North West province of South Africa. When Andrew was four years old, his family moved to the city of Johannesburg, where he currently resides. Andrew Ntshabele is influenced by his surroundings - his embodied experiences of growing up during the apartheid era and subsequently witnessing the transition to a democracy in creation of a post-apartheid South Africa.
